## **I. Breve bosquejo de la personalidad académica e historiográfica del profesor Paul Preston**

Paul Preston (Liverpool, 1946) inició sus estudios universitarios en el Oriel College de la Universidad de Oxford. Poco después se trasladó a la Universidad de Reading, donde cursó el Máster en Estudios Europeos. Regresó a Oriel College para ponerse a trabajar en la redacción de su Tesis Doctoral. Una vez finalizados sus estudios de doctorado fue contratado por la Universidad de Reading para desempeñar un puesto de Profesor Titular. Alcanzó la Cátedra de Historia en el Queen Mary College el año 1985 y desde 1991 es Catedrático de Historia Internacional en la prestigiosísima London School of Economics de la Universidad de Londres.

El profesor Paul Preston ocupa la cátedra Príncipe de Asturias de Historia Contemporánea española y es, desde su fundación en 1996, director del Centro Cañada Blanch para el estudio de la España contemporánea de la London School of Economics & Political Science (LSE). Educado en Liverpool y en la Universidad de Oxford, de 1973 a 1991 fue sucesivamente profesor de Historia en la Universidad de Reading; el Centro de Estudios Mediterráneos, en Roma; y el Queen Mary College de la Universidad de Londres.

Analista de asuntos españoles en radio y televisión tanto en Gran Bretaña como en España, ha sido asimismo un asiduo colaborador sobre temas históricos en diversos periódicos y revistas. En 1986 le fue otorgada la Encomienda de la Orden del Mérito Civil, y en 2007 la Gran Cruz de la Orden de Isabel la Católica. En 1994 fue elegido miembro de la Academia Británica, en 2005 recibió el Premio Internacional Ramón Llull por parte del Gobierno Catalán, en reconocimiento por sus excelentes aportaciones al estudio de la Segunda República, la Guerra Civil y el régimen franquista; y en 2006 fue elegido miembro de la Academia Europea de Yuste (dicha Academia cuenta con treinta miembros honorarios, entre quienes se encuentran prestigiosísimas personalidades del mundo de las artes, las letras y las ciencias tales como Reinhard Selten, Mstislav Rostropovich, Alain Tourain o Peter Schaffer). En 1998 ganó el Primer Premio “Así Fue”, con su obra *Las tres Españas del 36*, que fue un gran éxito de crítica y público. Tiene una reconocida trayectoria científica que le acredita como uno de los más destacados historiadores de la edad contemporánea así como, quizás, el más

importante de una larga saga de acreditados hispanistas anglosajones. Continuador de la larga tradición del hispanismo británico, sus primeras obras, como *La destrucción de la democracia en España* o *España en crisis*, constituyeron un poderoso acicate para el desarrollo de la historiografía española. Recientemente, ha sido nombrado Doctor Honoris Causa por las Universidades de Valencia, Barcelona, Rovira i Virgili y Extremadura.

Además de todo lo anterior, entre los principales méritos que, a nuestro juicio, convierten al profesor Preston en un dignísimo acreedor del reconocimiento como Doctor Honoris Causa por nuestra Universidad, destacaría los siguientes:

1. En primer lugar, mencionaríamos su notabilísima contribución a la renovación historiográfica sobre aspectos decisivos de nuestra reciente historia contemporánea, tales como el derrumbe de la Segunda República, los orígenes de la guerra civil, el señalamiento de la importancia de la voluntad conspirativa contra la democracia republicana esgrimida incluso por las derechas accidentalistas aparentemente comprometidas con ella –caso de la CEDA–, la reconstrucción del perfil biográfico del general Franco o el análisis minucioso de las violencias desencadenadas durante nuestro último y más cruento conflicto civil en ambas retaguardias. Insigne defensor de lo que podríamos denominar la “interpretación progresista de la II República española” y los orígenes de la Guerra Civil, el profesor Preston ha encabezado siempre una línea de argumentación historiográfica rigurosísima frente a las sucesivas interpretaciones revisionistas o neo-revisionistas en torno a esta crucial página de nuestra reciente historia. Por todo ello, el profesor Preston ha llevado a cabo, a lo largo de casi cuarenta años de profesión, una fructífera labor en la difusión y divulgación, a nivel global, de la historia reciente de España

2. En segundo lugar, haríamos hincapié en su ingente y voluminosísima aportación al conocimiento de la España del siglo XX a través de sus más de 30 libros, un centenar largo de artículos y numerosísimas contribuciones en forma de prólogos, capítulos de libros, comentarios periodísticos, documentales históricos o entrevistas en programas de televisión o radio. Entre sus más prominentes obras destacaría, entre las traducidas al español (que son casi todas), las siguientes: “La destrucción de la democracia en España”, “La Guerra Civil Española”, “La República asediada”, “La política de la venganza. El fascismo y el militarismo en la España del siglo XX”, “Franco, caudillo de España”, “Juan Carlos. El rey de un pueblo”, “Las tres Españas del 36”, “Palomas de

Guerra”, “Idealistas bajo las balas”, “El gran manipulador. La mentira cotidiana de Franco”, “El Holocausto Español”, “El zorro rojo. La vida de Santiago Carrillo” o “El final de la guerra”.

3. Por último, cabría señalar su excelente ejecutoria en la dinamización de los estudios de alto nivel sobre la historia del siglo XX español y su capacidad para fomentar el diálogo entre distintas escuelas historiográficas, contribuyendo a la formación académica de varias generaciones de brillantes investigadores y especialistas en la historiografía española reciente. Desde la dirección del *Cañada Blanch Centre for Contemporary Spanish Studies* el profesor Preston ha dirigido decenas de magníficas Tesis Doctorales, convirtiendo la mencionada institución académica, que forma parte de la prestigiosa London School of Economics, en un activo y vivacísimo centro internacional, en cuyo seno se han llevado a cabo debates historiográficos y discusiones académicas de un hondo calado.

## I.1. Vinculación del Profesor Paul Preston con la Universidad de Granada

Desde el mencionado Centro de Investigación, el profesor Preston ha mantenido estrechos vínculos académicos con diferentes profesores e investigadores del ámbito de la Historia Contemporánea de la práctica totalidad de los Departamentos de la mencionada área de conocimiento repartidos por la inmensa mayoría de las Universidades Públicas españolas. Asimismo, el profesor Preston ha forjado una tupida red de lazos interpersonales y contactos profesionales con una gran cantidad de especialistas en los ámbitos de la Historia Contemporánea, la Antropología, la Ciencia Política y la Sociología diseminados en distintos departamentos de nuestra propia Universidad de Granada. En concreto, el profesor Preston ha colaborado estrechamente con el personal docente e investigador de los Departamentos de Ciencia Política y de la Administración, Sociología e Historia Contemporánea, impartiendo cursos de doctorado, dictando conferencias o participando en distintos eventos académicos, co-dirigiendo proyectos de investigación, asesorando a numerosos doctorandos o acogiendo a jóvenes investigadores, tanto en el seno del Department of International History, como en el ya mencionado Cañada Blanch Centre for Contemporary Spanish Studies, ambos dependientes de la London School of Economics.

Precisando aún más, debemos hacer constar que el profesor Preston ha colaborado estrechamente con destacados especialistas de nuestra Universidad en los campos de la Ciencia Política o la Historia Contemporánea. Ha mantenido estrechos contactos de colaboración académica con los profesores Antonio ROBLES EGEA, Antonio TRINIDAD REQUENA y Francisco COBO ROMERO. Este último, Catedrático de Historia Contemporánea de la Universidad de Granada, llevó a cabo tres estancias de investigación, invitado por el profesor Preston, que se desarrollaron en el seno de la London School of Economics de la Universidad de Londres. Dichas estancias investigadoras discurrieron entre los meses de marzo, abril y mayo de los años 1996, 2001 y 2006. De igual manera, el profesor don Antonio TRINIDAD REQUENA ha invitado reiteradamente al profesor PRESTON para que colabore con el Departamento de Sociología de nuestra Universidad en la puesta en marcha de jornadas académicas de diferente significación. En el seno de una de estas jornadas académicas, el profesor PRESTON pronunció, el mes de marzo de 2004, una conferencia en el Salón de Actos de la Facultad de Ciencias Políticas y Sociología de nuestra Universidad.

Por otro lado, el profesor PRESTON ha participado en la co-edición de algunas publicaciones en las que han colaborado diferentes miembros del Departamento de Historia Contemporánea de esta Universidad. Por último, no podemos dejar de mencionar la brillante ejecutoria desempeñada por el profesor Preston en todo lo relacionado con la dinamización de un aquilatado debate académico, de gran altura intelectual, en torno a cuestiones de vital importancia, especialmente de todas aquellas que han contribuido a la edificación de una memoria compartida de la sociedad española sobre las más trágicas y traumáticas experiencias de nuestro pasado siglo XX. Como trataremos de probar más adelante, exponiendo detalladamente las características que adornan los innumerables eventos académicos centrados en el estudio y la reflexión sobre el pasado reciente de España, tanto el profesor Preston como la institución universitaria que ha presidido desde su fundación (nos estamos refiriendo al Cañada Blanch Centre), se han convertido en referentes inexcusables para todos aquellos que de una u otra forma se han interesado por el análisis sosegado y el conocimiento profundo de temáticas historiográficas tan esenciales para comprender nuestro presente como las que guardan relación con las grandes tragedias sufridas por la sociedad española en el pasado siglo XX o con la significación del régimen dictatorial franquista y la huella indeleble que imprimió sobre el sentir colectivo de los españoles.

En tal sentido, cabe mencionar que, gracias a la incansable labor del profesor Preston, el ya mencionado Cañada Blanch Centre se ha convertido, a lo largo de los últimos veinte años, en un prestigioso centro de investigación de alcance internacional, donde se han dado cita no solamente prominentes personalidades del mundo de la política, la cultura, el arte, las letras o las ciencias, sino asimismo destacados investigadores universitarios y reconocidos científicos sociales que han disertado en torno a cuestiones de primerísimo interés público, tales como las causas que desencadenaron el conflicto militar de 1936-1939, las políticas públicas para la recuperación de la memoria de los vencidos en el mencionado conflicto, el rastreo de las características mostradas por las represiones llevadas a cabo por los bandos en pugna, las dimensiones internacionales de nuestra última guerra civil, y un largo etcétera.
